



About Raspberry Pi

The Raspberry Pi Foundation is a UK-based educational charity that works to put the power of computing and digital making into the hands of people all over the world. We want more people to be able to harness the power of digital technologies for work, to solve problems that matter to them, and to express themselves creatively.

Established in 2008 and first known for our product – the wildly successful Raspberry Pi computer – the Foundation has developed educational content and programmes that are helping millions of people learn new skills. In 2012 we established Raspberry Pi Trading Limited, a wholly-owned trading subsidiary that manages all of our commercial activities.

In October 2015, we merged with Code Club, followed in May 2017 by a second merger with the CoderDojo Foundation. Together we now represent one of the largest, sustained global efforts to help young people learn computing and digital making.

In 2018, we were part of a consortium that was awarded £82m of Government funding to establish the National Centre for Computing Education to provide support and training to computing teachers in every school in England.

Overview

The Foundation is governed a board of trustees (currently eight) that is responsible for ensuring we use our resources effectively to advance our charitable goals, and that we comply with all relevant charity, company, and other legal and regulatory requirements. The board also oversees the activities of the Foundation's Group companies, including Raspberry Pi Trading, Raspberry Pi North America, and the CoderDojo Foundation.

We are very fortunate to have an exceptionally strong board that brings significant experience of technology, engineering, industry, education, and much more. We are currently looking to appoint up to three new trustees to join the Foundation's board.







Person Specification

To be successful in this role, you should have:

- The ability to think strategically about the Foundation's mission, priorities, and values, using data and evidence effectively to inform decisions.
- An understanding of the responsibilities of a charity trustee and company director.
- High levels of personal integrity and ethics.
- Good, independent judgement, political impartiality, and the ability to think creatively in the context of the organisation and the external environment.
- The ability to constructively and critically challenge as part of a team.
- A commitment to the mission of the Raspberry Pi Foundation and the time to contribute on a volunteer basis for at least a period of three years.

We are particularly keen to diversify our board. So in addition to a diverse background you'll ideally have some or all of the following:

- A connection to the communities that support the Foundation's mission.
- Strategic communications, digital engagement and marketing expertise.
- Experience as a non-executive board member in either a commercial or charitable context.
- Executive or non-executive experience of a charity that owns a significant trading company.
- Experience raising significant levels of philanthropic funding.
- Experience of evidence-based policy making, learning and education.








Terms and Conditions

Trustees are unremunerated and reasonable expenses are paid in line with the Foundation's expenses policy. The anticipated total time commitment for the role of Trustee averages over the year at one day per month. The appointment will be from October 2019 for an initial three-year term of office with the potential for an extension for a further three-year term. Board meetings are held six times a year at the Foundation's headquarters in Cambridge.

In addition, there is an annual strategy away day held in May or June. The board has a small number of sub-committees, including Pay and Remuneration and Nominations.

Outside of board and committee meetings, trustees are encouraged to visit the Foundation's activities, attend special events, and work with staff on particular areas of expertise. This appointment will be made by the board on the recommendation of its Nominations Committee, and ratified by the Foundation's membership at the next AGM.
